The Davis County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Monday, October 26, 2020, with Chairman Ron Bride and Members Alan Yahnke and Matt Greiner present.

Alan Yahnke made motion, seconded by Ron Bride and carried unanimously, to approve the agenda.

There were no public comments.

Alan Yahnke made motion, seconded by Ron Bride and carried unanimously, to approve and sign the Minutes of Monday, October 19, 2020. Matt Greiner abstained from voting since he was not present at the last meeting.

The Board met with custodian Randy Norman, who reported on roof repairs needed for the building on 203 S. Madison. The Board tabled the approval of such repairs until the next meeting, when it will be placed on the agenda.

The Board met with Engineer Ryan Schock, who stated that the pavement surfacing for the highway West of Drakesville, will begin on Wednesday, October 28, weather permitting. He also reported that there will be single-lane traffic allowed on a Timber Avenue bridge, North of Pulaski, while bridge approach repair is being completed.

Matt Greiner made motion, seconded by Alan Yahnke and carried unanimously, to approve an application and letter of support for Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP).

The Board met with County Recorder, Megan Clyman, who requested approval of Megan Price for promotion to the position of Deputy Recorder, and Traci Lynch to Part Time Passport clerk. Matt Greiner made motion, seconded by Alan Yahnke and carried unanimously, to approve said position appointments.

After discussion regarding the Davis County website domain authority, Alan Yahnke made motion, seconded by Matt Greiner and carried unanimously, to approve the authority of the Davis County Website domain be delegated to the Board of Supervisors.

Matt Greiner made motion, seconded by Alan Yahnke and carried unanimously to approve the Annual Cost Allocation Report for Department of Human Services Expenditures from Cost Advisory Services, Inc.

All Board members reported on committee meetings attended.
